## RELEASING COVID-19 CASES AND CONTACTS FROM ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE



## CASES Case released Minimum 10 days **Onset date** from isolation Must be isolated for a minimum of 10 days\* after symptom onset (or specimen collection and can be released after afebrile (without fever-reducing date if onset unclear or medication) for at least 24 hours and improvement of other + Afebrile and if asymptomatic) symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath) feeling well for at OR least 24 hours Has 2 negative COVID-19 tests in a row, with testing done at least 24 hours apart (A test-based strategy is no longer recommended in Note: Lingering cough should not prevent a case from being the majority of cases. Consult with Infectious Disease MD.) released from isolation. \*A limited number of persons with severe illness may produce replication-competent virus beyond 10 days; this may warrant extending duration of isolation and precautions for up to 20 days after symptom onset. Consider consultation with infection control experts. CLOSE CONTACTS<sup>1</sup> Date of last contact with **Minimum 14 days** Must be guarantined for 14 days after the last/most recent infectious case contact with the case when the case was infectious. If a close contact develops symptoms, they should follow **Close contact is** isolation rules for cases above released from quarantine Household Contacts: Household contacts with separate living quarters between case and contacts: quarantine for 14 days after last exposure to case. LTC residents or Household Contacts that share a room/living guarters (i.e. have ongoing contact with or exposure to the case): quarantine during contact and for 14 days after case is released from isolation. <sup>1</sup> For COVID-19, a close contact is defined as any individual who was within 6 feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days prior to positive specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated.
