
Student Recognition Convo



best on these important standardized tests. Not only do these scores provide students and families with key information on their strengths and areas for growth across content areas and skills, they are also used as part of our course recommendation process. Additionally, teachers refer to these data points to provide individualized and group-level academic support in the subsequent school year.



As a reminder, students will need to bring their student ID, fully-charged iPad, pencils and approved calculator. Please note that students will not be able to access their phones during the entirety of the testing session.

On Monday, April 7, all freshmen, sophomore and junior students will complete important digital readiness steps during Glenbard Hour in advance of testing. Any students who are absent from their Glenbard Hour should reach out to Mr. Bergantino immediately to be sure they are able to complete the important pre-testing steps prior to testing.

Families of juniors should read the <u>Information on Sending ACT Scores</u> which covers important information regarding two available options for juniors to send their ACT scores to colleges and/or universities for free. Each option has a deadline so it is important to review this information carefully.

preACT scores will be shared with families once they become available. There is no account setup required.

As a reminder, testing information is outlined below:

• preACT for Freshmen and Sophomores

- Test Date: Wednesday, April 9, 2025
- Freshmen and Sophomores will both take the digital preACT. Students testing with standard time are scheduled to be dismissed at 11:25am. *This is a non-attendance day for juniors and seniors.*

School Day ACT for Juniors

- Test Date: Thursday, April 10, 2025
- All juniors will take the digital ACT with Writing. Students testing with standard time are scheduled to be dismissed at 12:40pm. A snack will be provided during the break, though students are allowed to bring their own as well. This is a non-attendance day for freshmen, sophomores, and seniors.

AP Update

AP exams are right around the corner! Our <u>Glenbard West 2025 AP Testing Schedule</u> is now available for students and families to review. Please note that this is a live document and may change in alignment with space availability and capacity as we near May.

As all exams have been ordered at this point in the year, please have your student log into their College Board account to confirm that the correct year-long, 1st semester and/or 2nd semester courses are showing in their myAP classroom. All courses that appear represent exams ordered unless otherwise indicated. If you know that your student no longer intends to take one or more of the exams ordered or you identify conflicts with any of the exam dates listed, please contact the office of the API as soon as possible to review available options.

It is important that families review our latest edition of the <u>AP Guide for Families - Vol. 3 / AP Guide for Families Vol. 3 - Spanish</u> which covers important information and answers frequently asked questions about AP exams.



Monthly Attendance Insights: Every Day Counts

Showing up matters for **R.E.A.L.** because it is an opportunity to:

- Build Routines
- Increase Engagement
- Provide Access to resources
- Support Learning



Routines: A daily attendance routine can help students reduce stress and develop habits that are valuable for their future careers.

Engagement: Being at school gives students a chance to interact with friends and build relationships with teachers and staff.

Access to Resources: When students show up to school, they can get access to meals, health services, mental health supports, and extracurricular activities such as sports, clubs, music, and after-school or summer programs.

Learning: Students who miss less than a week of school each semester are more likely to pass their classes and graduate from high school.

Additionally, students can text a CRISIS Test Line: Text HOME to 74141 which sends information to a Crisis Counselor, a real-life human trained to help individuals return to a healthy/stable level of functioning.

Last year, the State of Illinois launched a school safety program called Safe2Help Illinois to raise awareness of the 21st-century threats facing school children in Illinois. Safe2Help Illinois will offer students a safe, confidential way in which to share information that might help prevent suicides, bullying, school violence, or other threats to school safety. 
