

- Exercise


- Do something to help someone



AP Exam Schedule

It's hard to believe, but AP exams are starting next week! Families are encouraged to read Volume Four of our AP Guide for Families available in English and Spanish. You'll find important information about our AP exam schedule, testing locations, and answers to frequently asked questions. Students are encouraged to get ample sleep, eat a healthy breakfast and dress comfortably for testing.

ACT and preACT Scores

Scores are in from the recent ACT exam and should be available in students' myACT accounts if the test was taken on the original testing day of April 10th. Make-up date scores should be available soon. If students are using option #2 to send their scores, they can review the steps necessary here.

If students are having issues accessing their ACT scores:

- ACT confirmed that students must call ACT directly for any issues schools cannot do this on their behalf.
- If students did not create a MyACT account within two days of testing, they will receive a
 unique code on their paper score report that they can use to access their scores or create a
 MyACT account.
- Paper copies of score reports will be sent to the schools and distributed to students once available.
- Click <u>here</u> for the message juniors received in Schoology on Monday from Mr. Bergantino.

preACT scores will be shared with the school and distributed to students and families once available. Students should contact their counselor with any questions. Thank you for your patience as we navigate distribution of the score reports and support juniors with the new score send process with ACT.



Average Daily Attendance

The end of the school year is close, and that means exciting events like awards nights, Prom, and Graduation, but it also means stressors like finals and semester grades. Our goal is to make sure all students finish strong as they close out their school year, whether it's their first year at West or their last.



Unfortunately, we saw a dip last month in our overall Average Daily Attendance to 90.67%. Our highest percentage this year was 94.82%. The best way you can support your student to finish this school year strong is to make sure they are here at West every period, every day. Our goal is to reach 95% Average Daily Attendance for the rest of this school year.

Monthly Attendance Tip

Help your student wind down for the night by encouraging calming activities such as reading a book or listening to soothing music, about an hour before bed. Consistency is key—make sure they have a regular bedtime and wake-up time, even on weekends, to regulate their sleep cycle. Remember, screens—phones, laptops, or tablets—can interfere with sleep, so be sure to turn them off at least an hour before bed. Getting enough restful sleep will not only improve their mood and energy but also enhance focus, memory, and performance in school.




